

Could your child take part in our research?

We are looking for young people aged 11–16
who attend mainstream secondary school with a brain injury diagnosis

What is the study about?

We want to understand how well teachers and school staff know about acquired brain injury (ABI), and whether a short training session can help them better support children like yours. This is a PhD research study run by Louise Hawkley at Plymouth Marjon University.

What would my child be asked to do?

- 1 Complete some online questionnaires (with you at home).
- 2 Allow the school to share their attainment records as part of the study.
- 3 Join a short online group discussion after the teacher training is done.

A note for parents and guardians

You will be asked to be present throughout all online sessions. You will also be invited to watch a short information video with your child before they agree to take part.

You can withdraw at any time

Families may withdraw up to four weeks after the final session.

Is my child eligible?

- Aged 11–16 in mainstream secondary school in England
- Has a diagnosis of acquired brain injury (ABI)
- English as their first language
